FEDERAL MEETING SUMMARY

Kerry-Anne and I travelled to Melbourne to attend the Federal AGM and General Meeting held on the 26th September at the Melbourne Show grounds.

The day before the meeting we attended the judging of the Clydesdale breed classes in the indoor arena. The show was of the highest quality with good numbers of horses competing, nowhere near the numbers shown in years gone by however, but still over 40. Judging started at midday and did not finish until after 6pm. Aarunga Mark again succeeded as Supreme Champion Clydesdale.

At the meeting we were welcomed by the chair, and other committee members also made us feel very welcome.

During the elections at the AGM I was honoured to be nominated and voted in for the one of the positions as Federal Vice-President.

At the General Meeting, the previous meeting's minutes were submitted and accepted.

There were a number of issues raised at the meeting which I will summarise briefly. Further details will be submitted at our next SA branch meeting.

We had a brief visit by a non-member who wanted raise the Committee's awareness of a member supposedly bringing the CCHS into disrepute. The matter was discussed and it was moved that it did not involve CCHS and unless ownership could be proven no transfers would take place.

NORMAL MEETING BUSINESS ARISING

Constitution and Bylaws. Concerns over 21 day notification not given prior to change.

Federal Judges panel "Working with Children" clearances—Some judges did not feel they needed to do this and also complained. Some actually resigned from their Federal judging status. A sad response to changing times where most show societies require proof of "Working with Children" clearances. Some did not understand the process and needed assistance but this is to be expected due to an unprecedented change such as this.

Grievance matters QLD and WA both cases considered closed.

CCHS marketing, Web and Facebook

Web page needs overhaul with different pictures. Rod Bowles requested more images.

All images from different states will be sent to Barb and Louise Scott to be added to the web site.

SA notified that we now have a Facebook page.

Outcomes of registration difficulties.

Mostly all resolved but a bit slowly. Just one outstanding because of incorrect DNA results requiring further investigation.

Financial report — Moved and Accepted.

Remuneration of Secretary

Raised as requiring increase with inflation but Rod was concerned due to the current lack of financial viability of the Federal Council.

Colin Brown - Grading up proposal and Steven Wesselink - Grading up proposal

Colin had nominated a proposal for a grading up system which another member notified the Committee that he felt it was unconstitutional due to the motion not being advertised 21 days prior to the AGM.

Though a technicality Colin brown accepted the member was right and withdrew the proposal but resubmitted a second proposal 'for discussion' not to be voted upon.

This second proposal topic took a lot of time to discuss with the Delegates fairly split over the facts. As previously discussed at our meeting in SA we support the motion in principal but many fine points needed to be determined. What Colin wanted the Executive and Delegates to see was that this Grading up scheme is already in place internationally and is in fact much more open than what he is proposing. Many horses in Australia now carry these bloodlines of upgraded horses from Scotland. He only wished that we control this, not Scotland.

Internationally they can use any Clydesdale 'type' Stallion over a pure Clydesdale Mare to produce a 1st generation upgrade.

Any Male progeny must be neutered.

1st generation upgraded females can only breed with pure Clydesdale Stallions to produce a second generation upgrade.

2nd generation male progeny must be neutered

 2^{nd} generation Females can only be bred with pure Clydesdale stallions to produce registerable progeny as Full Clydesdale.

This in effect means the progeny that could then be registered would be 7/8 Clydesdale.

Colin proposed that we use only 'Pure registered Shires' approved by the Committee before they can be used in the upgrade process.

Most of the complainants had progeny as a direct result of the international upgrade system but were concerned on the 'purity' of the Australian Clydesdale type. Due to this confusion and a lot of discussion, argument and debate it was decided to let members investigate information on breeding up prior to the Sydney General meeting and arrange a member's workshop to present information. This will then be reviewed at the Sydney meeting before a proposal is submitted at the next AGM.

Bob Pearce was one of the main protestors and he did apologise to me post meeting for his outbursts but he is passionate about the Australian Clydesdale.

Other Business

John Valada from WA was nominated for his Federal Judge re-assessment. Moved to allow him to be re-assessed. Accepted.

Mrs T Cox resigned as a Federal Judge.

On a side note there was much discussion as to the direction of showing across Australia with numbers dwindling and Royal Show Societies being less helpful. Ideas to boost and promote were welcome. Members were also concerned at the lack of younger exhibitors and breeders, which in effect are the future of the Clydesdale breed society. Hence the great support Kerry-Anne and I received at Federal.




